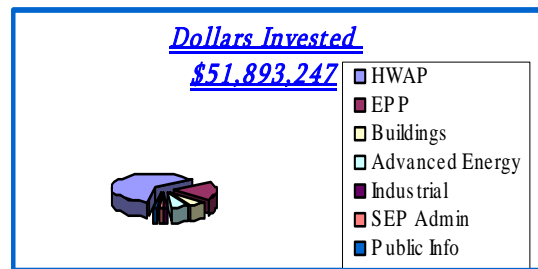
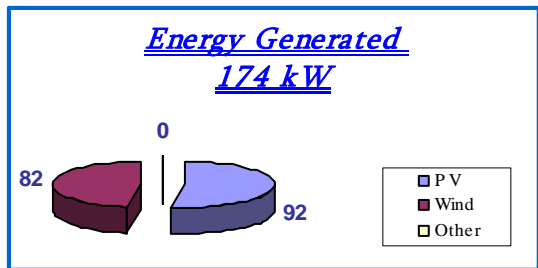
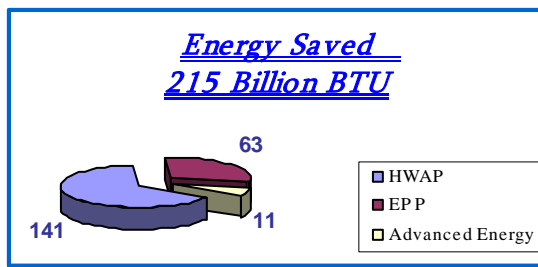

The Office of Energy Efficiency (OEE) envisions a robust economy supported by multiple energy sources, energy efficiency and advanced energy technology that add value to the quality of life for all Ohioans. OEE directs the state's weatherization program (HWAP) for low-income households, administers public benefits fund for energy efficiency and renewable energy, manages an electric base-load reduction program, and administers fuel cell funds. OEE also oversees the State Energy Plan (SEP) and conducts SEP Special Projects for the State of Ohio. Project development and deployment, technical assistance, training, and outreach are conducted in advanced energy technologies, alternative fuels infrastructure, energy efficient buildings, competitiveness for Ohio industry, public information, and curriculum development.
